Writer was dispatched to above location where a Dead person was reported. Writer was met at the SW Corner of the Building by complainant and led up the stairs to room 771 along with Fire Rescue (Lt. Hoffman's Crew), Sgt. Cichowicz. As writer entered room 771 it was noted that all the lights were on. The carpet was wet outside the main door for a circle of about 5 feet. The carpet was wet inside the full length of the room. Writer observed a WM laying face up in about 6" of water in the bathroom tub. There was skin on the side of the tub and on the floor in the water. There was also skin partially covering the WM's face. The WM was identified as Josephus Anthonius Havenith (#13 Above) by complainant. Department ID was call for an Tech. Bowers a lived on the scene to process. The medical examiner was contacted by Det. Fire and Alice Sharp came to the scene to make a preliminary investigation for the ME's office. Tassillo removal services was called for and Mr. Robert Hunt, Chris Craft, and Pete McKay of Tassillo's was on the scene to remove the body. Tech. Bowers and Alice Sharp both photographed the scene. Tech. Bowers took what valuables were found in the room into property to be claimed by next of kin.

While interviewing witnesses the following was found.			
At approx 1500 this date two unknown young WF's were walking down the hall of the 7th floor			
and observed water running under the door to room 771 and flagged down a maid. The maid was			
identified as Susan E. Engelhart WF 33 210 S. Ft. Harrison 443-5855. Ms Engelhart states after			
the girls notified her she unlocked the door(door was locked from the inside) looked in and saw			
the body in the tub with the water running. The maid then closed and locked the door and told			
security who was Mr. Dave E. Heald WM 27 of 2056 US19 S. Rm.248 Phone 535-5545 or 443-5855.			
Mr. Heald states that he then went to the room unlocked the door and went in finding the body.			
Mr. Heald states he turned off the water (thought it was the hot water).., locked the door and			
notified complainant who notified the police department. Shortly after writer arrived on scene,			
Lt. Hoffman pronounced the victim dead on the scene at 1550. Writer noticed that rigor mortis			
had set in. The water in the tub was still warm. There was a lot of skin floating in the tub			
over the victims face and on the edge of the tub were water had ran over the edge. This was			
apparently caused by the hot water. Writer has been unable to locate anyone who saw the victim			
lately so the last time he was seen alive is still unknown. Complainat found that three people			
knew him . all are residents of the Hotel. Mr. Herbert Heiler, Mr. Albert Ruesch and Mr. Albert			
Lipshutz. Complainant will try to contact them to make an ID of the body and also to pin down			
when victim was last seen alive. The victim was from Germany and has a twin brother who is a			
catholic priest in Berlin W. Germany. Victim was apparently a music teacher as there were half			
written songs in various places throughout the room. There were bottles about the room containing			
the following vitiams--B-Complex, B-1, Niacin, Mega-B, Mega-B 125, C-1500, A&D, Cal-Mag and E-1000.

Victim arrived at the Hotel on 22 Dec 79 from Germany and was staying at the Hotel for spiritual reasons. Writer found a note on the bed, apparently written in victims hand, telling the maid to please change his bed cloths. No date on the note but it was lying on top of a blanket on the edge of the bed. None of the people on the property knew if subject had been under a doctors care but didn't think he had been sick. Complainant will call with additional information as it becomes available to him. Complainant is trying at this time to locate next of Kin to advise them of the death. There was a note on the door saying Sleeping. Mr. Bowers took both notes and the things of value found in the room and will supplement this report. After the body was removed by the removal service it was transported to the medical examiners office for tests. The room was sealed by Tech. Bowers with tape. The hotel will secure the property left in the room once they recieve clearance from the Police Department.

Writer contacted Ted Proyland who advised that he will see that the acquaintances of the victim are at the M.E.'s office by 1600 this date to identify the remains. Writer advised Alice Sharp at the M.E.'s office of this information. Writer contacted the W. German Consulate's office in Miami (305-358-0290) and was advised that this incident must be taken care of by the Atlanta office. Writer then contacted the Atlanta office of the W. German Consulate (404-659-4760) and was advised that everyone was in a meeting with the Consulate General. Writer left writer's name and number and advised that this was in reference to notifying next of kin in the death of a German citizen temporarily in this country. Writer was assured that the call will be returned.

Alice Sharp at the M.E.'s office advised that it will probably be several days before the M.E.'s report is completed. Preliminary indications are that the death was from drowning; however, that is not a final official report.

On 25 Feb 80 writer received a phone call from the Consular General's office of W. Germany which is located in Atlanta. Mr. Bachmann of that office was advised of the situation here, and writer requested a notification of next of kin. Mr. Bachmann advised that he would assist in that regard and that he would advise writer when such notification has been made.

On 26 Feb 80 writer received a telephone call from Mr. Bachmann and he advised that the next of kin had been notified in the Netherlands. He further advised that the victim is a Dutch citizen. He advised that information had been relayed to the next of kin as to how to contact this writer. Mr. Bachmann could not provide this writer with the name of the next of kin nor an address.

On 27 Feb 80 writer was contacted by Betty Cook, representing the Dutch Consulate's office in Tampa (933-1045). She advised that the next of kin have been notified and that she has been in contact with the Dutch Consulate's office in Houston who has jurisdiction in this matter. She advised that she will provide writer with the name and address of the next of kin. She also requested information about the victim's belongings; some of which are at the P.D. and rest at the Ft. Harrison. Writer contacted Paul Gloninger of probate. He advised that a telegram from the family authorizing release and shipment of the victim's property would be sufficient to release the property without going through probate court. Writer advised Betty Cook of this, and she advised that she will obtain such a telegram. She also advised that she will have a courier pick up the property when this agency is prepared to release it.

Betty Cook requested that the victim's passport be returned to her so that it might be returned to the issuing agency. Writer advised that it will be sent to her at the conclusion of this agency's investigation of the death.

Writer was advised by Alice Sharp at the M.E.'s office that identification of the victim has been made by Hubert

On Sun. 24 Feb 80, at 3:40 PM writer was advised by Lt. Sibbert that there was a dead person at Scientist Bldg. on the 7th floor and requested writer be 10-51. When writer arrived at the scene E. Hoffman and his crew from the PD rescue were at the scene along with Sgt. Cichowicz and Ptl. Velong. Also there was Ted Froyland, Legal Advisor for the Scientist. Writer went into room 771 and noted all the lights were on, the carpet in the room was all wet, and the carpet leading into the room from the hallway was wet. Writer observed a W/M laying face up in about 6 inches of water in the bathtub. Skin was removed from victims arms and face and looked like the hot water was left running scalding parts of his body and causing the skin to fall from his body. Writer then contacted M.E. office and advised them of the situation. At this time Alice Sharp came to the scene and she and writer conducted a preliminary investigation of the victim and at the time could not find any criminal activity on the body. Writer advised Mr. Froyland that due to the fact that this was an unattended death that once we remove the body that we would have to seal the room. The body was removed by Tassillo Removal Services after we were done with our investigation. After Tech. Bowers completed his work he sealed the apt. Ted Froyland gave us victim's full name and told us that he had no other information concerning relations that could be staying at the hotel. He knows that they had friends here by the name of Hubbert Heller, Albert Ruegg, and Albert Lipshutz. He was trying to contact them for us to interview them with negative results. Writer told him that if he doesn't have anyone for us to contact in the morning that Det. Eastridge will pick up the investigation and he will contact next of kin and make all necessary arrangements. Writer told him that the body would not be released until the M.E. is done with the autopsy. INVESTIGATION CONTINUES.

Writer contacted Ted Froyland of the Scientologist and advised him that I had to interview the maid Susan Engelhart, the maid who found the body and David Heald, who was called to the room by the maid after she found the body. Mr. Froyland set up appt. at 1:30 PM for writer to interview both subjects at the Ft. Harrison. Interview was conducted in the restaurant. Writer asked the maid, Susan Engelhart to tell me what she knew about the case and what she saw. She stated on Sun, the 24 Feb at about 9:45 AM she was on the 7th floor and she went by room 771 (victim's room) and saw a small white piece of paper on the door. On it was a handwritten note, stating, Sleeping. At this time she went about her other duties. At about 3 or 3:15 PM that date, while she was working on the 7th floor, 2 unknown W/F's approached her and stated that it was very wet in front of the door at 771. At this time she went to 771 and noticed that the rug in front of the door was soaking wet. The note was still on the door. At this time she took her pass key and opened the door. As she entered the room she could hear water running. She looked into the bathroom and the door was ajar. There was a W/M in the tub laying on his left side and a little better than half of his head was under the water. She stated the tub was filled and water was running over. The water seemed like it was hot water. When she quickly looked at the body she thought it was toilet paper or soap that was on his face and arms hanging. This turned out to be skin that was fallen away from the body. She stated that she closed the door and went down to the front lobby and told David Heald that there was a man dead in the bathtub on the 7th floor. At this time Mr. Heald told writer went to 7th floor and used pass key to enter room. He told writer that there was water, soak in the rug in

he saw a W/M laying on his left side, half of his face in the water and his right arm was out of the water and he noticed that it was red. The water was running, he thought at a medium flow and the tub was overflowing. At this time he went into the bathroom and turned off the hot water spiket. He immediately left the room, closed the door and contacted the fire rescue and PD. He also contacted Ted Froyland who is on the Legal Staff of Scientologist. Writer attempted to contact Lt. Hoffman, fire rescue, to find out what they saw when they first arrived at the scene. Writer was advised by Asst. Chief Davidson, that Lt. Hoffman & his crew were off, that they would be back on duty on March 9 at Station 44, 442-6127. Writer advised him that Det. Kastridge had the weekend duty, that he would contact Lt. Hoffman.

EXTERNAL EXAMINATION: The body is that of a well developed, well nourished, white male measuring 68 inches and weighing an estimated 170 pounds. The head is covered by moderate length gray hair. The eyes appear to be gray or blue. The corneas are extremely cloudy. The sclerae are white. No petechiae are identified. There is skin slippage on the forehead covering an area measuring 4 by 2 inches. There is skin slippage distal to the bridge of the nose by 0.5 inch which measures 0.75 inch in greatest dimension. It is reddish-brown. The mouth contains teeth in good condition. No abrasions of the lips are evident. The neck shows an irregular blackened pattern covering an area measuring up to 3 by 1.75 inches which begins at the sternal notch and extends upward to a level below the thyroid cartilage. It is formed of multiple areas of blackening with intermittent areas of more normal appearing skin. A linear area of blackening measuring 4 inches in length and up to approximately 0.1 inch in width is noted beginning 1.5 inches to the left of midline immediately above the superior aspect of the clavicle and extending posteriorly at the junction of the neck with the shoulder. The chest and abdomen show extensive skin slippage with post mortem yellow-brown parchment like discoloration of the skin. There is extensive venous prominence within the parchment like areas. These areas are noted most prominently over the flanks and extending downward onto the legs, involving both the upper and lower legs, with the skin slippage being more prominent over the upper legs. Swifter changes are seen over the arms. No scars are seen about the wrists. No fresh needle marks are identified. Examination of the back reveals skin slippage and venous prominence similar to that previously described over the flanks. It bears an area in the mid-back measuring 5.5 inches vertically and 1 1/2 inches horizontally. It also bears the majority of the buttocks.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION: The body is opened by means of the usual Y-shaped incision revealing moderate subcutaneous fat and moderate pale pinkish-tan musculature. The organs of the body lie in their normal positions when the body cavities are opened. No free excess fluid is found in the pleural, peritoneal or pericardial cavities. No areas of ecchymosis are evident in the subcutaneous tissues of the chest or abdomen.

TRACHEA AND LARYNX: The trachea and larynx are removed and examined along with the hyoid bone. The hyoid bone is freely movable. There is no evidence of fracturing. The thyroid cartilage is fractured to allow visualization of the inner aspect of the larynx. The larynx is filled with frothy blood-tinged foam. No petechiae are seen in the epiglottic mucosa. Well defined oval hemorrhages are noted distal to the level of the vocal cords bilaterally on the posterior and lateral aspects of the larynx. None are noted anteriorly. There is dark gray to purple discoloration noted bilaterally in the pyriform sinuses. This does not appear to represent hemorrhage.

LUNGS: The left lung weighs 890 and the right lung weighs 970 grams. The external surfaces are pink to bluish-purple. The lungs are doughy and they tend to stand by themselves. The bronchi contain frothy fluid similar to that seen within the trachea and larynx. The lungs ooze dark red dark red blood and a marked amount of frothy fluid on cut surface. No foci of consolidation, infarct, tumor or emboli are identified.

SPLEEN: The spleen weighs 150 grams. The capsule is intact and is pink. The cut surface is moderate reddish-purple. Malpighian corpuscles are not identified.

GASTROINTESTINAL TRACT: The esophageal mucosa is not remarkable. The stomach contains approximately 200 cc. of partially digested food material including possibly tomatoes and some type of green vegetable. In addition, there is a bright yellow formed, somewhat lozenge shaped portion of granular material identified within the stomach contents and is retained within a cup along with the stomach contents. No unusual odors are evident. The remainder of the gastrointestinal tract reveals no abnormalities.

PANCREAS: Autolysed.

LIVER: The liver weighs 1790 grams. The external surface is reddish-brown. The margins are sharp. The gallbladder is present and contains approximately 5 cc. of viscid bile. The cut surface of the liver is gray. The liver is soft and fractures without difficulty. It is minimally greasy. No tumors or areas of hemorrhage are identified.

ADRENALS: No abnormalities are noted.

INTRA-ABDOMINAL LYMPH NODES: No abnormalities are noted.

SKIN, MUSCLES AND BREASTS: See External Examination of the body.

BONES: No abnormalities are noted.

GENITOURINARY SYSTEM: The capsules of the kidneys strip without difficulty revealing smooth surfaced reddish-brown kidneys together weighing 310 grams. The corticomedullary junctions are well demarcated. The pelvis reveal no abnormalities. The ureters appear patent. The bladder contains approximately 70 cc. of dark yellow clear urine.

HEAD: The scalp is reflected and the calvarium removed in the usual fashion. No areas of ecchymosis are evident in the subcutaneous tissues of the scalp. No fractures of the calvarium are evident. No epidural or subdural collections of blood are seen. The brain weighs 1480 grams. The vessels at the base of the brain reveal no abnormalities. The brain is fixed prior to further dissection.

HEART: The epicardial fat is abundant. The left main coronary artery measures 6 mm. The coronary arteries are thin-walled, elastic and widely patent, with essentially no arteriosclerosis. The endocardium is blood stained. The valve surfaces reveal no abnormalities. The aorta shows minimal arteriosclerotic change. The left ventricular myocardium is soft and pale tan. No areas of hemorrhage or fibrosis are identified within the myocardium. The heart after opening weighs 370 grams.

BRAIN AFTER FIXATION: The brain after fixation weighs 1470 grams. Vessels at the base of the brain reveal no abnormalities. No foci of contusion are noted over the cerebral hemispheres. Cut surface of the cerebrum, cerebellum and brain stem reveals no areas of hemorrhage, softening or tumor formation.

MICROSCOPIC EXAMINATION

LIVER: Section of the liver reveals no inflammatory infiltrate or hemorrhage. There is no fatty change. Portal triads are easily identified.

HEART: The heart shows mild to moderate variation in the size of myocardial fiber nuclei. No inflammatory infiltrate or hemorrhage is identified. There is marked fragmentation of fibers, apparently artifactual in origin.

THYROID: The thyroid shows slight scattering of colloid within acini. No evidence of malignancy is present. No inflammatory infiltrate is evident.

CEREBRUM, CEREBELLUM AND BRAIN STEM: Sections of cerebrum, cerebellum and brain stem show no evidence of inflammatory infiltrate, tumor or hemorrhage. Purkinje's cells are easily identified within the cerebellum.

CORONARY ARTERIES: Two sections of coronary artery are submitted. One section shows essentially no arteriosclerotic change. The other shows minimal dilatation in the size of the lumen secondary to the presence of arteriosclerotic change within the vessel wall.

MICROSCOPIC EXAMINATION

LUNGS: Sections of the lung reveal pink-staining field is many alveoli along with hemorrhage. No inflammatory infiltrate or tumor is noted. No presortan thrombi are identified.

KIDNEY: Section of the kidney reveals normal cellular glomeruli. Tubular nuclei remain easily identified. There is no inflammatory infiltrate or hemorrhage noted. No tumor is seen.

HEART: Additional section of heart shows a large caliber blood vessel present within the myocardium and surrounded by a moderate amount of fat. There is no hemorrhage evident. There is fibrosis about vessels within the myocardium in this section and there are small foci of fibrosis cysts which replace individual myocardial fibers.

As a result of this information, this case will be closed as a natural death.
