

EXTERNAL EXAMINATION: The body is that of a well developed, well nourished, while well measuring 65 inches and weighing an estimated 170 pounds. The bood is covered by moderate languar gray hair. The eyes appear to be gray or blues The corneg are extramaly cloudy. The sclerm are white. No petechiae are identified. There is skin slippede on the forehead covering an area measuring 4 by 2 inches. There is skin slipping distal to the Bridge of the nose by 0.5 inch which measures 0.75 inch in greatest dimensions. It is reddish-brown. The mouth contains teeth in good condition. No abresions of the line are evident. The chest and ubdomen show extensive skin slippage with post morten yellow-brein parchagit like discoloration of the skin. There is extensive venous proximence within the perchant like areas.
