- That affiant is a medical doctor licensed and practicing medicine in the State of Michigan and
 the attached corriculum vitae is incorporated herein.
- 2. The affiant has been called upon to express opinions concerning the physical condition and cause of death of Lisa McPherson during her stay at the Fort Harrison Hotel from November 18, 1995, to December 5, 1995. Thave reviewed the autopsy photographs, microscopic slides and protocol from the medical examiner's office, the caretaker logs from the Fort Harrison Hotel, the emergency room records of Morlon Plant Hospital, the emergency room records of New Port Richey Hospital, as well as the depositions of Robert Davis, M.D., Joan Wood, M.D., Bonita Portilano, Flynn Lovett, M.D., David Minkoff, M.D., and nurses from the New Port Richey Hospital, i.e., Theresa A. Kilmaszewski, R.N., Richard Pemberton, R.N. and head nurse, Barbara Schmid, R.N.
- Based upon reasonable medical probability and after review of the above information, affiant
 has reached the following opinions:



- (a) That Lisa McPherson was in a coma for at least five to six days prior to her death pronouncert on December 5, 1995;
- (b) That Lisa McPherson died as a result of severe dehydration;
- (c) That during the fast five to six days of Lisa McPherson's title, it would have been obvious to a person of average intelligence that Lisa McPherson was in need of urgent medical care;
- (d) That the death of Lisa McPherson was not sudden nor accidental;
- (e) That there is no evidence that Lisa McPherson sustained any injury in the motor vehicle accident of November 18, 1995;
- (I) That Lisa McPherson did not die as a result of a pulmonary embolism;
- (g) That the physical condition of dehydration of Lisa McPherson was entirely preventable and reversible had she been taken to competent medical healthcare providers; and
- (h) That the insect bites appearing in the autopsy photographs of Lisa McPherson, and in particular, on her hands and feet, are afternortem and peri-mortem/postmortem.
