I am over 18 years of age, and have personal knowledge 19 of the events set forth herein. I am the appointed personal 20 representative of the estate of John Barrow. 21 2. John had been involved in a serious plane crash in July, 22 1989. Ann, his wife, of 22 years, died as a result of the crash, 23 and John suffered severe injuries, including burns over 27 24 percent of his body, ruptured internal organs, short bowel 25 syndrome, etc. In November 1989 he was hospitalized for 26 congestive heart failure due to an infection and decreased

resistance due to injuries suffered from the crash.

3. In May, 1990 I married John Barrow. At that time, John was an active member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints (Mormon). John introduced me to the Mormon Church, and I was baptized into the Mormon Church by John personally in June, 1992.

## JOHN BARROW'S INVOLVEMENT WITH THE CHURCH OF SCIENTOLOGY

- 4. In early 1991, John read <u>Dianetics</u> by L. Ron Hubbard and became interested in the Auditing program offered by the Church of Scientology.
- 5. In July, 1991 John began taking courses from the Church of Scientology in Phoenix, Arizona, starting with the "Ups and Downs" course.
- 6. John's purpose in associating with Scientology was to obtain certain promised results to clear his mind and body from the effects of traumas and bad experiences in his life, including the plane crash John survived, the emotional trauma, his own injuries and the subsequent death of his first wife.

  Representatives of the Church of Scientology promised John that through their program he could be returned to the physical, emotional and mental condition that he was in before the plane crash. Each course offered by Scientology promised certain benefits, as indicated by Exhibit 1.
- 7. In 1991, John was an active and practicing Christian attending a local congregation of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. John held a responsible position in his local ward (roughly equivalent to a "parish"), attended church services

weekly, paid a full tithe (ten percent of his earnings) and participated in other church activities.

- 8. At the time he became associated with the Church of Scientology, he was told that he did not have to become a "member" of the Church of Scientology, but that if he became a "member" he would receive discounts for the courses he wanted to take.
- 9. In order to receive the discounts John took out a membership. At that time he was not asked to abandon his Christian beliefs, nor was he asked to embrace the religious or spiritual teachings of the Church of Scientology. To my knowledge John felt more like he was becoming a member of a "group", not a religion.
- 10. From 1991 to 1992 John paid over \$150,000.00 to the Church of Scientology.
- 11. During this time he took some courses from the Church of Scientology. Each course was offered at a specific price.

  The following is a list of some of the courses John took:
  - 1. Ups and Downs of Life
  - 2. TR's and Objectives
  - 3. Over 200 hours of Auditing
  - 4. Therapeutic TR's Course
- 12. John also paid for courses which he did not receive including, to the best of my recollection, the following:
  - Professional Hubbard Dianetics Auditors Courses (Levels 0 - V)
  - 2. Method One

- 3. Ministerial Course
- 4. New Pro TR's Course
- 5. Solo II New OT I OT III
- 6. OT Preps/Eligibility

- 7. New OT V Audited NOTs
- 8. Hubbard Solo Course Part 1

John also paid for various books, tapes, and other materials.

13. At no time during the time John was associated with the Church of Scientology was he asked to abandon his Christian Beliefs nor did John view any of the therapies or techniques of Scientology as "religious" practices. He always considered these practices in the same category as psychological therapy.

14. Prior to, during, and after the time John was associated with the Church of Scientology he remained a practicing, believing Christian and member of the Mormon Church. John would often tell me that while the Church of Scientology represented itself as a religion, it was not, in his opinion, a religion, and John did not feel that he had joined any type of religion.

Dianetics were the representations made that through the auditing process, he could become free from physical and emotional pain, undesirable emotions, and the ups and downs of life. He was promised that he could be returned to the same emotional and physical health that he enjoyed prior to the plane crash in 1989. John did not join for the spiritual purposes, nor did any representative of the Church request that he abandon his own religious beliefs or embrace any of Scientology's religious beliefs. Even though he became a "member" of the Church of Scientology, that action was taken solely because that was a way to obtain discounts. At no time was he asked to embrace any

religious or spiritual doctrine, nor did he.

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16. John was promised that if he took the courses and followed the program that he would receive the benefits of freedom from emotional and physical pain, undesirable emotions and freedom from the ups and downs of life.

## EFFECTS OF SCIENTOLOGY UPON JOHN BARROW, OUR MARRIAGE, AND MYSELF

- 17. As a result of the therapy and treatments received from the Church of Scientology, the following effects occurred:
  - a. John developed psychosomatic congestive heart failure symptoms.
  - b. John had a violent physical confrontation with me, which resulted in John pointing a loaded pistol at me.
  - c. John filed to divorce me. The Divorce petition was subsequently withdrawn.
  - d. John became paranoid about his personal safety, following rumors about Scientology being a cult, from which he might be kidnapped and "deprogrammed."
  - e. John found it increasingly difficult to perform in his job with Arizona Public Service.
  - f. John was given the APS' Minnesota Multiphasic
    Personality Index (MMPI) test, for nuclear plant
    security, which he failed. He was then put on
    psychological probation and his clearance to enter
    site security areas was revoked, pending participation
    in the company's psychological counseling program.
- 18. The Scientologists also tried to convince John to divorce me, and in May of June of 1992, John moved out of the

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- 19. As a result of the actions by Scientology, I also suffered physical and emotional harm including severe depression. I suffer from chronic fatigue immune disfunction syndrome which is aggravated by stress. Scientology's actions have caused me great stress which has resulted in problems with my stomach, back and sleeping disorders.
- 20. In May or June of 1992, Ms. Chantal Code of the Advanced Organization of Los Angeles (AOLA) a parent organization to the local Scientology Group did a "FLUB" check or review of the work done by the local organization. This review determined that the work done by the local organization was not properly done.
- 21. It was and is the Church's written policy to return payments. See Exhibit , a publication discussion various activities in 1996-1997. ("Donations Promptly refunded to Any dissatisfied student or preclear in accordance with the policies of the Claims verification board. If the Preclear or student is dissatisfied and demands it within three months after the training or processing. the only condition being that he may not again be processed or trained.") See Also Exhibit , entitled "Information for Service Applicants." (It is the practice of the Church of Scientology to require and accept fixed offerings or donations for its auditing and training services from members who elect to become preclears or students. Subject to the policies of the Claims Verification Board, refunds/repayments of monies

donated in respect to delivered/undelivered services or portions thereof will be granted to any Preclear or student who is no longer in agreement with the Creed of the Church; however such persons will not again be audited or trained.) As a result of the problems caused by his association with the Church of Scientology, John requested a full refund of all monies paid for which services had not been rendered. (See Exhibit 

attached). In accordance with the stated policies John also wrote to the Advanced Organization of Los Angeles Church of Scientology Western United States, (AOLA) as required by Church policy requesting a full refund. That request was sent certified mail, return receipt requested. AOLA declined receipt of the letter, which was returned unopened. The original unopened envelope with enclosures is in my attorney's file.

- 22. The Advanced Organization of Los Angeles (AOLA), to which John had paid \$54,730 agreed to refund all amounts paid, which was completed in July of 1993.
- 23. John had also paid \$43,072 to the Phoenix organization for services not received, plus additional monies for some services which were provided.
- 24. The Phoenix Organization also agreed to refund monies, and between September 1993 and August 1994, \$6,500 was refunded. Many of the refund checks were accompanied by written notes promising me that more payments would be forthcoming:
- (a) On September 1, 1993, with a payment of \$500.00, John DeNiro of the local Church of Scientology wrote: "Wilma, This payment of course is a drop in the bucket. We have put aside

another \$500 which will be sent to you this coming Friday.

As I mentioned, I want to get you a lump sum as soon as we are able to. This will depend on the production in the upcoming weeks. I will be in touch." (Exhibit 5 attached).

- (b) On March 31, 1994, John De Niro wrote: "Dear Willie, Enclosed you'll find a check for \$2,500. I am doing my best to get a substantial flow going." (Exhibit & attached).
- (c) On May 19, 1994, with a payment of \$1,000.00 John De Niro wrote: "Willie, We will keep the flow going. I am doing what I can to speed up the process." (Exhibit 7 attached).
- 25. A schedule showing the refunds made is attached as Exhibit g. The last refund was made by the local Church of Scientology in August of 1994. No further refunds were made.
- 26. John died in February of 1993. I was appointed personal representative of his estate pursuant to his will. A claim against the Church of Scientology was listed among the assets of the estate.
- 27. The Church of Scientology expressly discourages individuals seeking refunds from retaining counsel and from resorting to the court system. (See attached Exhibit 9-"RETURN OF DONATIONS.") I was told that I had to proceed through their own system. Phone calls from my attorneys to the Church of Scientology were not returned.
- 28. When I met with representatives of the local Church of Scientology, they refused to allow anyone to accompany me to the meetings.
  - 29. Because of these Policies of the Church of Scientology,

I did not retain counsel to pursue any action against the church, nor did I file any legal actions.

- 30. I was further deterred from seeking counsel or filing any legal action because the Los Angeles Group, as well as the local Church of Scientology did in fact refund some monies, after John passed away. I relied upon the church's policies and actions in my decisions not to pursue legal action.
- 31. I am claiming in this action a full refund of monies paid for which no services were rendered in the approximate amount of \$43,000 (less any amounts previously repaid). I am also claiming a full refund of monies paid for services which were rendered because I believe that said services were not performed properly and therefore the monies paid should be refunded.
- 32. In my capacity as personal representative I am also claiming damages for breach of the duty of good faith and fair dealing because those duties arise out of the contracts which were signed and the Church has breached those obligations by failing to properly perform it's duties, resulting in emotional and physical distress John Barrow.
- 33. I am also claiming damages for negligent infliction of emotional distress because of the harm done to John Barrow and myself as a result of the action of the Church of Scientology.
