Scientologists ask for probe of Interpol

WASHINGTON — The Church of Scientology asked Rep. Don Edwards, D-Calif., Tuesday to investigate Interpol regarding allegations that the international police organization illegally circulated material on political and religious groups.

John Stanard, director of Scientology's national public affairs office, also claimed that Interpol members antagonistic to the United States, such as Iran and Cuba, can receive confidential material from the Paris group.

Interpol, which stands for the International Criminal Police Organization, has 136 members who share information in an attempt to track down criminals.

Although Interpol's charter prohibits the dissemination of information about political and religious groups, Stanard said he had learned that information about his church had been transmitted from Interpol's U.S. office to its Canadian office.

Edwards, chairman of the House subcommittee on civil and constitutional rights, was traveling overseas and could not be contacted. His staff on the subcommittee said they had received the letter, dated Dec. 18, but could not comment on whether it would lead to a probe.

Beverly Sweatman, a spokeswoman for Interpol's Washington office, said, would not comment.
