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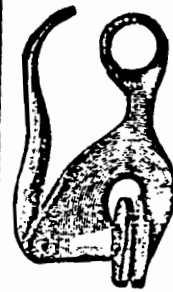

The Juniors have contributed largely to the musical organizations, being well represented in the Band and in both girls and boys' glee clubs. Juniors winning individual honors in the State Music Meet include Edwin Jasmin, Franklin Gordon, Helen Grossman, Kirby Hoon, Everett Batten, Lyle Houle and Mildred Thomas.

Phil Roberts, a Junior, has been editor of the Nugget this year, and aided by his competent staff, composed largely of Juniors, has made the paper a success.

Ellen Galusha represented Helena High in the Extemporaneous Speaking Contest, winning first place in the district, and placing in the state finals. Ronald Hubbard was one of this school's entries in the State Essay Contest.

Altogether, this class has been one of the best and most active in this school.

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State Oratorical Contest



Ellen Galusha was the representative of Helena High School at the State Oratorical contest which was held at Butte this spring. To be entitled to go to Butte, Ellen had to place first in two preceding elimination contests. At the trials at the High School she placed first, speaking on the subject of the "Submarine S-4." She then took first place at the District Contest at Dillon, with a talk on Flood Relief. She was one of the sixteen speakers, gathered from all parts of the state, who competed at Butte. The contests at Butte were in two parts; a preliminary contest, which eliminated half of the contestants, and the final contest to select the winners. No opportunity for research was given in the preliminaries, and the final contestants were chosen for their general knowledge of the subject matter, and their ability to speak. Ellen discussed Prohibition, and was one of the eight selected to speak in the finals. Her subject there was: "Resolved, That the People of Montana Should Organize to Promote the Candidacy of Senator Walsh for the Presidency."

Although Ellen was not among the first three in the finals, still she did very well, and Helena High School has every reason to be proud of her.

• Extemporaneous Essay Contest



The Extemporaneous Essay contest is coming to be recognized as one of the leading events of the school year. Its progress is especially notable by the increase of contestants. While in 1927 only nineteen turned out to write, thirty answered the call of the pen in 1928. Five of the thirty essays were sent to Bozeman. They were written by Esther Johnson, Stanley Davidson, Betty Foote, Leah Stewart and Ronald Hubbard. From all the High Schools of the state nine are chosen to write in the state contest. Helena High was so fortunate as to be represented by two of the nine, Betty Foote and Ronald Hubbard. During the state basketball tourney at Butte the final contest was held for final honors. Betty Foote ably represented Helena High by winning second place in the state when writing on the subject of "Shoes." Betty deserves much credit for her excellent showing, and the High School is certainly proud of her.

Besides placing second in the extemporaneous writing contest Betty has done very many other fine things for the school of which we are justly proud. This spring she again proved her ability by winning first prize in the State Chemistry Essay contest.

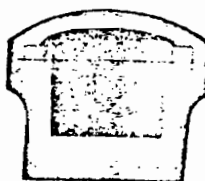
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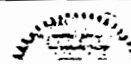

SURGEON DIES AFTER TWO MONTH ILLNESS

L. O. Waterbury, 67, retired veterinary surgeon, died last night shortly before midnight at his home at 736 Fifth avenue. Death came quietly, the result of an illness of two months.

Mr. Waterbury was born in Michigan in 1867 and came to Helena 12 years ago. He resided in this city continuously since that time. He followed the profession of veterinary surgeon for some years after his arrival here but retired several years ago.

Surviving members of the family include the widow, Mrs. Ida C. Waterbury, and six daughters and one son who are: Mrs. D. K. Roberts and Mrs. H. A. Morris of Helena; Mrs. A. H. Small, Charleston, S. C.; Mrs. R. DeCamp, Pittsburgh, Pa.; Mrs. C. E. Tyson, Seattle; Mrs. H. R. Hubbard, Washington, D. C., and R. D. Waterbury, who resides in Canada.

The body was taken to the Opp and Conrad funeral home. Funeral arrangements have not been made.
