





 - a. INDEARD is the founder of the Scientology cult which has been described variously as a science or religion the preaches self-improvement and purports to offer insight to the future and a release from past troubles. HUBBARD preaches reincarnation and claims he has visited heaven twice and knows how to separate the spirit from the body.
 - b. MUEBARD, who is reportedly a millionaire, invested heavily in Rhodesia and had a profitable Scientology practice there, but was expelled in July 1966 after an official investigation of his activities.
 - Washington, D.C., and other U.S. citics. The U.S. Food and Drug Administration has attacked the cult for distributing misrepresentative health devices and literature. a decision rendered in February 1969, the U.S. Court of Appeals ruled that since the Scientology organization had made a case uncoatested by the Government that it was a religion, a 1963 raid on its headquarters was illeguence it violated its constitutional rights. 





SUBJECT: Call-In Denunciation of Scientology

1. On the morning of 27 January 1971 I took a call on the office's listed line from an individual who said he vished to warn the Agency of the retivities of the Church of Scientology in San Francisco. They will caller, who refused to identify himself, said that Scientology claimeds to be a church but that actually it had an atomic bemb project under two. The caller said that Scientology had been whicked out of Inglands and then had resorted to the subterfuse of forming a church in the USC. This was a subterfuse, the caller said, because Scientology is actually a politically notivated organization.

- political motivations, the caller became quite vague. He said that there were "rumors" about the stomic bomb project which "made sense when you put it together with other things," and he added that the developmental work was in progress on one of the seven ships which scientology maintains at sea as a part of its "Sez-Org. " One of these chips, the caller said, is off the coast of California and another currently in the Mediterranean. The caller said that Ron Mubbard, the organization's founder, is a nuclear physicist, that he carns \$140,000 per week, and that he might be obtaining fissionable material from Australia or Great Britain. The caller also said that there were rumors that Scientology was developing a Polaris-type submarine, but he could offer no details.
- 3. The caller said, in regard to political potivations of the group, that this could be understood by a reading of Eubbard's published works which are available at Scientology Readquarters in San Francisco. The caller said that Rubbard's essential desire is to control the worlds and that Scientology tought that anyone who disagreed with its preceptations a "suppressord" and that, as such, it was acceptable for Scientology gists to use any means against him. He said that there were remore of kidnappings and murders by Scientology of members who had become distillusioned with the organization. The caller also said that Scientology was tightly organized in military fashion, and he edded that he was started to death of the organization and what it was up to. He would not tell me, however, whether he had ever been a member of the organization.
- 4. The caller concluded by saying that there would be problems if TLA tried to infiltrate Scientology, because now nembers are subjected to a lie detector test as a part of an E-meter brainwashing indoctrina-

trate Scientolo 7 and that his information, while interesting, probably fell more within the purview of the FDI than our conditions listance that he call the FBI if he felt that Scientology was subversive. He indicated that he would probably call the FBI and perhaps military intelligence as well as the Atomic Energy Commission.

6. The caller did not sound obviously irrational, but he was unable or unvilling to provide substantiation for his allegations.
